- **Scrolling:** Moving the wheel up or down scrolls through web pages or documents.

- you can allow the page to slowly, automatically scroll, by moving the mouse a little after clicking.
- **Zooming:** Holding the Control (Ctrl) key while scrolling zooms in or out on a webpage or document.

4. Additional Buttons (On Some Mice)

Many modern mice have extra buttons on the sides, typically used for navigation or custom functions.

- **Back and Forward Buttons:** Navigate through web pages or folders.
- **Programmable Buttons:** Some gaming or ergonomic mice allow users to assign specific functions to these buttons.
