How to connect to the Wi-Fi

Connecting to Wi-Fi is a straightforward process that involves enabling Wi-Fi on your device, selecting a network, and entering the password if required.

Step-by-Step Guide to Connect to Wi-Fi

- Forget Network: If you have previously connected to the network but are having trouble now, try forgetting the network in your device's Wi-Fi settings and reconnecting.
